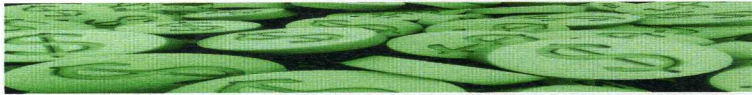

Brunswick County Solid Waste Department Spring Events

April 13th –18th **Free Dump Week at the Brunswick County Landfill Brunswick County.** Residents may bring items, except for household trash and land clearing debris, to the Landfill in Bolivia free of charge. Commercial vehicles will be charged normal tipping fees.

Saturday, April 18th **Household Hazardous Waste Collection.** The Brunswick County Solid Waste Department will be at Shallotte Middle School from 9 am to 2 pm to collect household hazardous waste. Items will be taken free of charge from Brunswick County Residents.

Saturday, April 18th **Electronic Recycling** The Brunswick County Solid Waste Department will be at Shallotte Middle School from 9 am to 2 pm collecting electronics for recycling. Items will be taken free of charge from Brunswick County Residents.

Saturday, April 18th **Clothing Drive** The Brunswick County Solid Waste Department will be at the Shallotte Middle School from 9 am to 2 pm collecting clothing. Items will be donated to a local non-profit agency.

Sand Fencing by Permit Only!

Sand fencing may only be installed for the purpose of: building sand dunes by trapping wind blown sand; the protection of the dunes and vegetation (planted or existing).

Sand fencing shall be placed as far landward as possible to avoid interference with sea turtle nesting, existing public access, recreational use of the beach, and emergency vehicle access.

Sand fencing installed waterward of the crest of the frontal or primary dune shall be installed at an angle no less than 45 degree to the shoreline. Individual sections of sand fence shall be spaced no less than ten feet in length and shall be spaced no less than seven feet apart, and shall not extend more than ten feet waterward of the of the following locations, **whichever is most waterward**: the first line of stable natural vegetation, the toe of the frontal or primary dune, or erosion escarpment of frontal or primary dune.

Non-functioning, damaged, or unsecured sand fence shall be immediately removed by the property owner.
