Wilmington Harbor Dredging Project

Sand will start being deposited on Caswell Beach on the weekend of 02/07/09. The contractor expects to be at Oak Island (McGlamery Street) around mid March, working west to around SE 74th (depending on available sand) and complete his work by the end of April.

The public and their animals are asked NOT to enter work areas due to safety concerns. (In addition to equipment moving about, there will be areas where the sand slurry has not drained and it is possible for people and pets to actually sink into the sand.)

The sand will be "soft" for several weeks after the project is done, and you will not be able to drive on it even with a four wheel drive vehicle. (NO Emergency or service vehicles will gain access)

On 01/28/09 a call came into the Oak Island 911 Center reporting that a citizen had suffered cardiac arrest. Oak Island EMS, Fire and Police responded to the scene along with Brunswick County EMS. After examining the victim it was determined that he needed to be transported to New Hanover Regional Medical Center as quickly as possible. The 911 Center requested NHRMC AirLink respond for the transport. Oak Island Fire&Police set up a landing zone on the soccer field at 46th and East Beach Dr. AirLink arrived quickly and the victim was flown to New Hanover Regional Medical Center and at last report was doing well.

This is a prime example of our public safety agencies working together to serve our community and save lives. Although many times their actions go almost unnoticed. It is comforting to know that our public safety agencies stand ready to respond 24 hours a day.
